An Entrepreneur in Residence (EIR) is a specialized, temporary role, typically held by an experienced entrepreneur, to support SOAR's mission by identifying new market opportunities and fostering the growth of startups. The EIR plays a vital role in building connections, providing mentorship, and guiding startups through essential early-stage challenges such as funding preparation and business scalability. For SOAR and Eastern Kentucky, the EIR will focus on building a foundation for economic growth by promoting innovation, researching market trends, and helping commercialize new ideas.

Key Benefits of the Entrepreneur in Residence Role

The EIR addresses critical barriers that SOAR Innovation clients face, especially access to capital and funding. Through their experience and network, the EIR will:

- **Prepare Startups for Funding:** Assist startups in becoming investor-ready through pitch preparation, business model refinement, and financial planning.

- **Facilitate Access to Capital:** Use established networks to connect startups with investors, grants, and other funding opportunities.
- **Identify Market Opportunities:** Research and evaluate market gaps that align with the region's strengths and SOAR's economic priorities.

Long-Term Goals Supported by the EIR Role

This role is central to achieving SOAR's long-term vision for Eastern Kentucky by:

- Preparing for the region's first \$100 million exit by 2035
- Attracting private venture capital investment
- Supporting the Southeast Kentucky Angel Fund's goal to close a \$1 million fundraising round
